

Report for Tredington Community Primary School

School has had another successful year.

An average roll of 60 pupils has been maintained, allowing the advantage of small class sizes. The downside to this is that the school has to operate with small financial input and has to budget extremely carefully. There is no room for error or any unexpected major expenditure.

Our S.A.T. results were above the national average. However due to the small number taking these tests the results do not give a satisfactory year on year comparison. We are much happier to look at value added for each pupil i.e. have they reached a higher standard of education.

School has very successfully entered into the extended schools policy. It has a very good breakfast club and after school provision. In addition it runs after school clubs in a variety of subjects.

We have a good working partnership with Tredington Teddies (Pre School Group). To facilitate this we have in the past year purchased and erected a further temporary classroom but how temporary is temporary.

The school actively takes part in several networking clusters as working with other schools has many advantages.

Special mention is due of our sporting achievements, which have been outstanding over a number of disciplines. This is quite remarkable given the fact that due to small numbers the same pupils tend to be involved in all the activities.

It is hoped that the planning application for the Coal Board Site clears the final hurdle. The potential for new pupils could have a large influence on the schools future.
